The opening two stanzas narrate the first Palm Sunday in the past tense, but the third stanza shifts to the present tense to emphasize what current singers do and believe. The repeated elements in this anonymous German tune suggest the repetitive patterns in a crowd's chant.

Call to Confession

Prayer of Confession

Holy God, we want to run into the streets and sing your praise! We want to be bold and unashamed of this good-news Gospel. Yet, too often we find ourselves standing against the wall. Too often we stay quiet and let others carry the song.

Forgive us for the moments when we could join the parade but instead find ourselves standing on the sidelines.

Show us which songs are ours to sing. Show us which parades are ours to lead, and then give us the courage and conviction to do both. With hope we pray, tune our hearts, O Lord... (*Time for silent prayer.*)


*Prayer of Dedication
