Prayer for Illumination



Scripture Lesson Luke 24:36-48 Page: NT 91 ³⁶ While they were talking about this, Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you." ³⁷ They were startled and terrified and thought that they were seeing a ghost. ³⁸ He said to them, "Why are you frightened, and why do doubts arise in your hearts? ³⁹ Look at my hands and my feet; see that it is I myself. Touch me and see, for a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you see that I have." ⁴⁰ And when he had said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. ⁴¹ Yet for all their joy they were still disbelieving and wondering, and he said to them, "Have you anything here to eat?" ⁴² They gave him a piece of broiled fish, ⁴³ and he took it and ate in their presence.

⁴⁴ Then he said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you—that everything written about me in the law of Moses, the prophets, and the psalms must be fulfilled." ⁴⁵ Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures, ⁴⁶ and he said to them, "Thus it is written, that the Messiah is to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day ⁴⁷ and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. ⁴⁸ You are witnesses of these things. *This is the Word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.*

WELCOME – BETH GOSS

Rev. J. Beth Goss retired from full-time Presbyterian ministry in 2020. She still is a member of the National Response Team of Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PCUSA) which provides pastoral care to areas after natural disasters. She has been responding to disasters nationwide since 1992 when Hurricane Andrew struck her own home in South Florida. The experience led her to seminary in 1997 and ordination in 2000. Since than her pastoral work has included leading congregations and groups to areas impacted by disasters: wildfires in California, shootings in New York and Ohio, flooding in Iowa and West Virginia, tornados in Virginia, Kentucky and Indiana, hurricanes on the Gulf Coast states, and fires and mudslides in California.

Beth grew up in the suburbs of Chicago, graduated from college in 1975 and business school in 1977. She worked as a CPA in Chicago and Miami, balancing a consulting practice, raising a family, and volunteer work for over 20 years before seminary in 1997 and her second calling as a pastor. Beth and husband Rollie are now retired in Herndon VA and delight in their three sons' families spread all over the US.
