## **GETTING AROUND TOWN:**

Parking is available: 1) in the City lot off West 3<sup>rd</sup> Street, 2) the M&T Bank lot (ok to park in bank customer spaces) also off W. 3<sup>rd</sup> Street, 3) spaces at E. 2nd Street and Chestnut near the River, 4) the open lot off Chestnut Street and 4<sup>th</sup> Street, 5) the lot at W. 3<sup>rd</sup> and South St. in Battery Park, and 5) on the street in most places in the City <u>OTHER</u> than in front of Town Hall, on cobblestoned Market Street and in the blocked off area on 2<sup>ND</sup> Street for handicapped parking.

Restrooms are available at the New Castle Visitor Center at the Arsenal; at the Courthouse, in the Presbyterian CE Building 25 E. 2<sup>nd</sup> Street; at the Read House; at the New Castle Library; and the City restrooms down the brick path off of Delaware Street at 2<sup>nd</sup> Street.
