

Scripture Lesson

Luke 2:1-7

Page: NT 58

In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. ² This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. ³ All went to their own towns to be registered. ⁴ Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. ⁵ He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. ⁶ While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. ⁷ And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

Hymn #140 v. 1 and 2 Once in Royal David's City




Like "All Things Bright and Beautiful" (see no. 20), this popular Christmas hymn was written by an Irish poet to illustrate for children the various articles of the Apostles' Creed. It is not known which of several English villages the composer had in mind when naming this tune.

⁸ In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. ⁹ Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. ¹⁰ But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: ¹¹ to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. ¹² This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger." ¹³ And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying, ¹⁴ "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favors!"

- 5 Then entered in those wise men three, 6 Then let us all with one accord full reverently upon their knee, and offered there in his presence their gold, and myrrh, and frankincense. Refrain
 - sing praises to our heavenly Lord, that hath made heaven and earth of nought, and with his blood our life hath bought.

"Nowell" is the English form of the French "noel," a shout of joy formerly used at Christmas (as in Chaucer's "Franklin's Tale"), a clue that the word is older than its first printing. It may have Latin and French roots related to "born" (natus / né) as well to "news" (nova / nouvelle).

WINTER SANCTUARY CLOTHING DRIVE & POP-UP DONATION SHOP

Winter Sanctuary is a program that First & Central Presbyterian Church has provided for more than 30 years. Every Saturday morning from 6 am to 10 am, November to March, First & Central opens its doors to those experiencing homelessness. In Dec 2026, the number of guests welcomed on a Saturday morning has risen to more than 150, nearly twice a typical Saturday in prior years. In addition to warm drinks, breakfast foods and a freshly baked treat, the volunteer crew provides 25-30 showers and fulfills more than 70 requests for clothing or toiletries each week. Keeping the shelves stocked is a challenge; here's how you can help:

- 1. Donate Gently Used Winter Clothing: We're collecting gently used causal, cold weather clothing including jeans, khaki pants, sweatpants, long sleeved shirts, sweatshirts, sweaters, coats, boots, sneakers, and comfortable shoes.
- 2. Shop Our Pop-Up Donation Show: Our special Winter Sanctuary Pop-Up Donation Shop will be open during fellowship hour and is filled with affordable shower services supplies including new underwear, t-shirts, sweatpants, and hygiene supplies. Come purchase items to donate to First & Central's shower services. Items will range in price from \$2 to \$10. Cash and check will be accepted. Checks can be made out to First & Central Presbyterian Church with "Winter Sanctuary" in the memo field.
- **3. Purchase from Our Amazon Wish List**: If you're not able to attend the Pop-Up Shop, items can also be purchased from our <u>Shower Services Amazon Wish List</u>. Items purchased will be shipped directly to First & Central.

4. **Sign up to Volunteer**: It takes 15-20 volunteers to make Winter Sanctuary happen every Saturday, and we're always looking to welcome more volunteers.
