Scripture LessonRomans 8:26-39Page: NT 158

²⁶ Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but that very Spirit intercedes^{*} with sighs too deep for words. ²⁷And God,^{*} who searches the heart, knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit^{*} intercedes for the saints according to the will of God.^{*}

²⁸ We know that all things work together for good^{*} for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose. ²⁹For those whom he foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son, in order that he might be the firstborn within a large family.^{*} ³⁰And those whom he predestined he also called; and those whom he called he also justified; and those whom he justified he also glorified.

we are accounted as sheep to be slaughtered.'

³⁷No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. ³⁸For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, ³⁹nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.


