

The roots of this English text come from a mid-8th century Greek hymn that continues to be used in Orthodox churches at the midnight Eucharist marking the beginning of Easter. The tune is named for the county in northwestern England where the composer was then an organist.



FRIENDSHIP HOUSE – SCHOOL UNIFORM DONATIONS

NCPC's Mission & Outreach Committee works closely with Friendship House and the Clothing Bank each year. Thanks to our generous congregation, hundreds of clothing donations are made each year to the Clothing Bank through our Fall Clothing Drive and Undie Sunday underwear drive in February. This May and June, we have the opportunity to donate to one of the greatest needs: School uniforms.

There are few resources for school uniform items like polo shirts and khaki/navy pants when families can't afford to buy them, but many schools in Delaware require them. This can place a burden on students and families as they strive to excel academically. In 2023, the Clothing Bank was able to provide over 10,000 uniform items to 18 public schools in Delaware. Their plan is to expand their reach incrementally until they are eventually serving the entire state.

NCPC can be a part of this effort, and it's so easy, you don't even have to leave your computer. We are asking NCPC members to make online donations during the months of May and June to help this worthwhile cause.
